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Alton Castle Retreat

On Friday 27 January, 40 pupils and 4 staff left school for a retreat at Alton Castle in Staffordshire. On the way, we stopped at Puzzlewood Forest where they have recently filmed the new Star Wars film to explore the woods and have our lunch. Many pupils found it exciting to be in the same place famous actors were not that long ago!



We then travelled on to Alton and arrived about 4pm. Once we had settled into our rooms and had our tea, we were split into our activity groups. We had a tour of the church and looked closer at the theme of our retreat which was 'Who Am I?' We were asked to think about how we viewed ourselves as well as how other people viewed us like our friends, family and God. We also went on a night walk in the wood, a very muddy experience! It was a good test of our trust skills and how we needed to be excellent communicators to keep everyone safe. We finished the evening with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, a quiet and peaceful way to bring everything together that we had done that day.



After a restful sleep, we were looking forward to our activities on the Saturday. After breakfast and morning prayer, we departed in our groups for activities such as biking, climbing, archery, trekking or survival. Each activity tested our determination, teamwork and resilience levels as well as helping us to reflect on our achievements with a meditation within each activity. The big group came back together at lunch and swapped stories about what they had done, ensuring that everyone was looking forward to another activity in the afternoon!

Once those activities had finished and everyone had had a chance to have a shower, freshen up and have their dinner we started to think about the mass we would be participating in later. We practised our hymns beforehand and it was great to hear all our pupils singing so joyfully! We then went over to the church and had mass with Fr Thé with some excellent readings and bidding prayers by our pupils. The brilliant singing continued all the way through the mass finishing with our final hymn called Burning in My Soul by Matt Maher. Look out for this one in school soon! We finished our evening on Saturday by having some games and a disco before night prayer in our activity groups.



We were greeted on Sunday morning by bright and glorious sunshine. It was great weather for us to take part in our final activity. It was excellent to see how pupils had really bonded together by this time, especially those who don't normally spend a lot of time together. Once our activities had finished we had our lunch and had an opportunity to buy some souvenirs from the tuck shop. After a final service to reflect on all that we had done and how it all fitted into our theme, it was back to the coaches and our long trip back to Bristol.

It was a packed weekend full of fun, laughter, kindness and faith. We are already looking forward to next year's retreat! A big thank you to all the staff who came with us on the retreat, giving up their weekend with their families to spend time with our pupils. Thank you also to the staff and team at Alton Castle who have yet again given us a fantastic experience and helped us grow closer to our faith and have a deeper relationship with God.

Governor Vacancy

Would you like to be more involved in your child's education?

If you would, why not consider becoming a school governor. There is currently a vacancy for a parent governor at St Bernadette Catholic Secondary School.

What do school governors do?

- Oversee the budget
- Help recruit staff
- Monitor the performance of the school, e.g. in examinations and key stage tests
- Advise on school policies and procedures
- Provide a vital means for parents and the community to get their views heard by the governing body as a whole

Are you interested?

If you are interested in becoming a parent governor but feel a little daunted by the responsibility you may be taking on, remember that full training will be available, and you will always act as part of a team.

What skills are required?

You will need an interest in the school and in the welfare of our children and the time and willingness to get involved. At the moment the governing body particularly needs governors who have expertise in legal matters. If you are someone with the required experience, would you consider applying?

Governors also need the ability to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question, and to make connections between different types of information.

Your Commitment

If you become a governor you will be taking on the following commitments to help make sure the school is well managed:

- Share the responsibilities of the governing body as summarised above.
- Attend and participate in governors meetings on a regular basis – the governors generally meet six times a year
- Undergo appropriate training
- You may also be invited to sit on appointment panels or attend committee meetings etc.
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You will be required to sign the governing body's code of practice, and to apply for a DBS enhanced disclosure.

What do you need to do next?

Read the section on our website which explains the process for appointing governors and also has a nomination form.

The closing date for nominations is 12 noon on Friday 17th March 2017. If you would like to know more about the role of parent governor or the appointment process you are welcome to contact the Headteacher or a serving governor at school.
